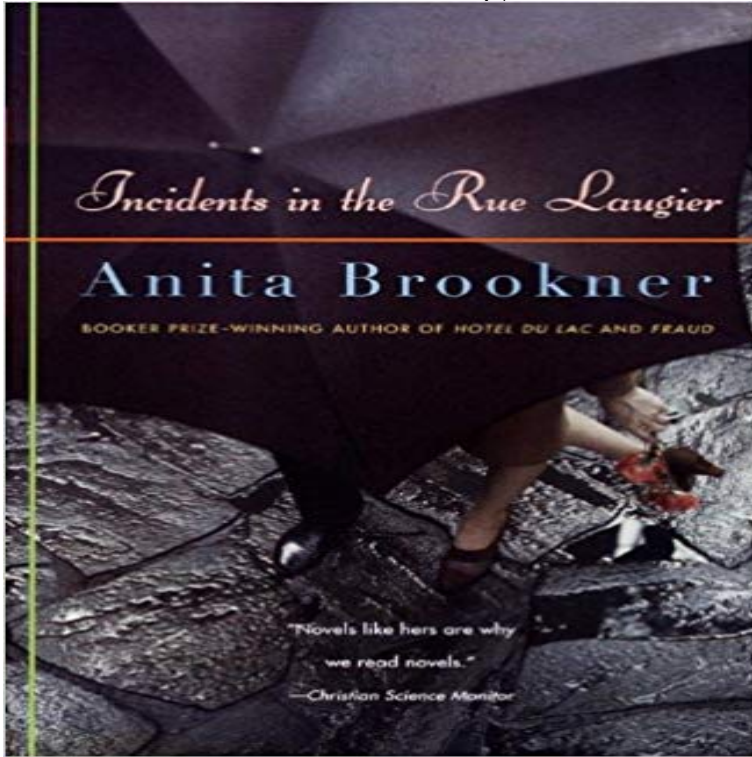


Incidents in the Rue Laugier
