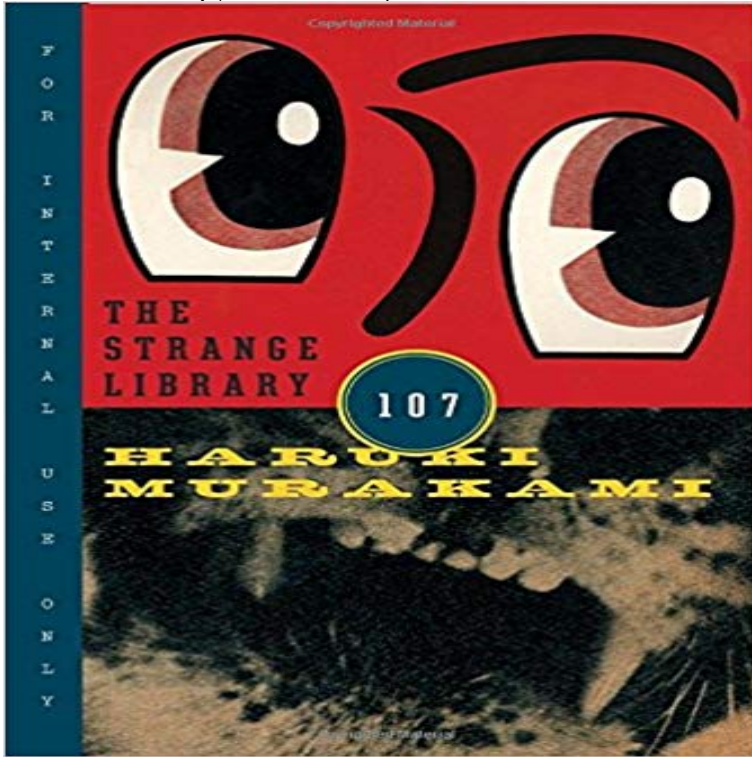


# The Strange Library
